- Ask children in your community to write letters in support of law enforcement.
- Participate in Project Blue Light. Proudly display your blue light in support of law enforcement.
- Organize an event or rally in support of your law enforcement officers.
- Advertise your support through local media outlets or billboards.

“The last couple of years have been trying times for police, but I know that these gestures of appreciation from the people we serve makes it all worthwhile for the men and women on the thin blue line,” declared Canterbury.
