Dear Representatives Pascrell, Collins, Visclosky, King, Demings and Fitzpatrick,

I am writing on behalf of the membership of the Fraternal Order of Police to advise you of our strong support for H.R. 2379, the “Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant Reauthorization Act.” The measure would permanently reauthorize the Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) program that was created with the strong support of the FOP in 1998—more than two decades ago.

This program began with a very simple goal: to increase the number of law enforcement officers wearing soft body armor by providing matching Federal funding to State and local law enforcement agencies purchasing this equipment. This legislation would permanently authorize this vital and life-saving program. The brave men and women in law enforcement will always need anti-ballistic protection and the BVP program has proven to be one of the most successful officer safety programs in the Federal government. Since 1999, more than 13,000 jurisdictions received a total of \$467 million in Federal funds for the purchase of nearly 1.35 million vests.

We recognize that there is no legislation, no government program, no grant or public-private partnership that can erase the sad fact that law enforcement officers will die. They will die in the line of duty at the hands of armed and violent criminals, who are increasingly targeting law enforcement officers with violence. The BVP grant program can document more than 3,100

officers whose lives were saved because they were wearing soft body armor. How many other government programs can document their success so starkly?

While we know there is no way to end the deadly risks inherent in a law enforcement career, we must also do everything possible to ensure that officers who put their lives on the line everyday also put on a vest. Body armor is one of the most important pieces of equipment an officer can have and often means the difference between life and death. It is critical that this program be permanently reauthorized so that it can continue to make these vests available to more officers in every region of the country. We urge its swift passage.

On behalf of the more than 348,000 members of the Fraternal Order of Police, I thank you all for your strong support of this life-saving legislation. Your continued leadership and steadfast support for our men and women in law enforcement is deeply appreciated.
