Dear Representative Clark,


I am writing on behalf of the members of the Fraternal Order of Police to advise you of our support for H.R. 909, the "Pet and Women Safety (PAWS) Act."

This legislation would expand existing Federal protections to the pets of domestic abuse victims and establish a grant program within the U.S. Department of Agriculture designed to assist victims of domestic violence to safely shelter their pets when they leave their abusers. Too often, domestic violence victims are reluctant to leave an abusive relationship because they cannot take their pet with them and fear that their abuser may harm the animal if they abandon it. Law enforcement officers have responded to domestic violence calls in which the victims were often just as concerned for the welfare of their pet as they were for themselves.

Domestic violence victims deserve our help and support when they leave their abusers and their recovery depends on emotional support that pets can provide. A well-loved pet can and does help people through difficult times and your bill recognizes this fact and provides this support.
