I am writing on behalf of the members of the Fraternal Order of Police to advise you of our support for S. 1300, the "Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant Program Authorization Act."

Violent crime continues to be a problem in many areas of the United States, affecting countless families and communities each year. The consequences of such crimes can be devastating, not only for victims and their loved ones, but also for the wider community. Law enforcement groups and other stakeholders are always looking for innovative ways to combat crime, especially violent crime, in our streets and in our neighborhoods.
