Dear Representatives Pappas and Fitzpatrick,

I am writing on behalf of the members of the Fraternal Order of Police to advise you of our support for H.R. 3366, the "Establishing Accreditation Grants for Law Enforcement (EAGLE) Act."

The accreditation of a law enforcement agency can increase their accountability, improve operational effectiveness, and enhance community trust. However, accreditation can be costly and time-consuming, especially for smaller agencies. Less than 10% of the nation's 18,000 law enforcement agencies are accredited.

Your legislation would establish a grant program that would pay the certification or re-certification fees for small and mid-sized law enforcement agencies. Rather than choosing between hiring an additional patrol officer or paying for accreditation fees, an agency could do both. An accredited agency can better serve its officers, employees, and the communities that they are sworn to protect.

On behalf of the more than 377,000 members of the Fraternal Order of Police, I thank you both for your support and leadership on this important issue.
